

Quick Guide: How to make a 'Herby Head'

1. Wash and save some 2ltr and 4ltr plastic milk containers and caps. You'll also need some scissors, sponge and craft items and paint to make a face on the container.



2. Cut out the bottom of the container, just along the moulded crease. Keep this part safe in case you want to make a stand for your Herby Head.



3. Turn the container upside down. The handle now resembles a nose on a face. Choose a funky hair style and carefully cut the plastic to suit. You can easily bend and roll the plastic into different shapes.



4. Carefully cut out a shape as shown at the back of the Head and make a hole in it.



5. Tear off a chunk of sponge and place it in the neck of the container (the bottom). Make a cardboard collar to fit snugly and slide it into the container.



6. Personalise your Herby Head by making a face on it. You can use enamel paints, rolling eyes, glasses, moustaches, big lips ... or anything!



7. Carefully fill the inside of the cardboard liner with a mix of perlite and compost. Sow seeds directly into the mixture and water in.



8. Hang your Herby Head up in a sunny spot and water occasionally. If the pot becomes waterlogged, unscrew the cap slightly to let excess water drain out.
